## Abstract & Poster Submission Guidelines

**Submission deadline: Midnight, Friday 1 May 2026**

We welcome submissions from all attendees working at the intersection of data driven technologies, AI and innovation in patient care. Whether you're reporting early-stage work or a fully deployed solution, if it moves the field forward, we want to hear about it.

## Submission Categories

Select the category that best fits your work. If unsure, choose the closest match, reviewers will take context into account.

| Category                             | Scope  |
|--------------------------------------|--|
| <b>Original Research</b>             | Studies advancing knowledge of AI in clinical settings - including deployment, scalability, interoperability, health economics and patient perspectives. |
| <b>Audit / Quality Improvement</b>   | AI-driven improvements to care quality, patient safety, or service efficiency, including model validation and comparisons with standard care.            |
| <b>Education &amp; Training</b>      | Novel approaches to AI literacy, medical education, ethics, data governance, or regulatory frameworks.   |
| <b>Innovation</b>                    | New or piloted technologies (with or without the use of AI) or co-designed solutions addressing NHS clinical challenges.                                 |
| <b>Clinical Case Report / Series</b> | Cases where AI contributed meaningfully to diagnosis, management, or outcome.  |
| <b>Survey</b>                        | Staff or patient perspectives, behaviours, or practices relating to AI in healthcare.  |

## Abstract Format

### Standard abstract (all categories except Case Reports)

Structure your abstract with the following headings:

- Title
- Authors - bold the presenting author's name
- Institution(s) and presenting author's email
- Introduction
- Aim(s)

- Methods
- Results
- Discussion
- Conclusion(s)
- Acknowledgements (if applicable)
- References (max 3)

## Formatting requirements

| <b>Word limit</b>        | 400 words (includes title, headings, acknowledgements, and figure legends; excludes references) |
| <b>Spacing</b>           | Single line   |
| <b>Font size</b>         | 11pt minimum (including text within tables and figures)   |
| <b>Figures / tables</b>  | One optional figure, chart, or table. Place below main text with a caption.                     |
| <b>References</b>        | Up to 3, in abbreviated format  |
| <b>Submission format</b> | One-page Word document (.docx) emailed  |

*Abstracts that do not meet the formatting requirements above will not be reviewed.*

## Ethical & Consent Requirements

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Include a brief statement confirming ethical or regulatory approval where applicable. If your work did not require formal ethics approval, a short explanation of why is sufficient.

Case reports require written patient consent for publication and presentation. You do not need to submit the consent form with your abstract, but you will be asked to confirm consent at the point of submission and asked to provide the signed form later.

Clinical photographs may be included provided written patient consent has been obtained.

## Use of Generative AI

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You may use AI tools to help prepare your submission. All content remains your responsibility - for accuracy, integrity, and originality. Declare any AI use at submission, specifying the tool and how it was used.

## Presentation & Awards

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Accepted abstracts will be invited for either an oral or poster presentation. Indicate your preference at submission - you can select both if you are happy with either.

The presenting author must be registered as a conference delegate. Any listed co-author may present on their behalf.

Prizes are awarded for both poster and oral presentations and will be announced on the day.

## Notifications

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All submitting authors will be notified of the outcome - whether accepted or not - within 2 weeks of the submission deadline.

All presenting authors should be registered to attend the event.

Poster / Oral presentation details will be released in due course.

## How to Submit

In your email please state:

- Your submission category
- Indicate your presentation preference (oral / poster / either)
- Confirm ethical approval or explain why it was not required
- Confirm patient consent (case reports / use of patient data)
- Declare any use of generative AI tools
